The Conference registration fee is \$45.00 per person. An early registration discount will be applied to applications received on or before May 15 (\$40.00 per person); a late registration penalty will be added to applications received later than July 15 (\$50.00 per person).

Registrants may enroll for one day's participation at a fee of \$20.00 per day.

All evening sessions are open to the public free of charge.

## Pre-conference Recital

---

Mr. Jan Overduin of Kitchener, Ontario, will play an organ recital on Tuesday evening, July 17, at 8:00 P.M.

Mr. Overduin, Professor of Music at Wilfrid Laurier University, was the first Canadian to pass the Associateship and Fellowship examinations of the Royal Canadian College of Organists at one sitting. He has received numerous awards in international competition and is recognized as a uniquely skilled improviser.

## Post-conference Workshop

---

The week following the Conference, Calvin College's annual Church Music Workshop will be held (on campus) July 23-26. This workshop is a series of highly concentrated class lessons in choral conducting (Professor Howard Slenk) and organ playing (Professor John Hamersma).
