This exhibition attempts
to enlarge the vision of the worshipping community of Christ,
to stimulate arts created to enhance the worship experience, and
to provide resources for future enrichment of our congregational spaces.

The artwork exhibited represents 24 artists from 11 states (coast to coast) and Ontario. You are invited to experience flying angels watching over you while you view worship enhancements in fabric, wood, metal, and clay.

Included are
fabric stoles, paraments (altar or lectern hangings), chasubles (cloak-like vestments), and banners; stained glass constructions; a wood collection plate, candle holders, and processional crosses; ceramic communion sets; and two metal advent wreaths—
one weighing about 45 pounds and hanging like a chandelier.

The gallery is located on the lower level of the
Spoelhof College Center.
