## Medallions Presented at 92nd Anniversary of Colonizing

Holland—More than 1,500 persons participated Thursday evening in a program commemorating the ninety-second anniversary of the colonizing of western Michigan by the Dutch. It was held in Holland High school auditorium.

Dr. Wynand Wichers, president of Hope college and The Netherlands Pioneer and Historical foundation, presented The Netherlands museum with five medallions as a gift from J. J. F. Beyne, Haarlem, The Netherlands, engineer. The medallions were received through W. K. von Weller, attache of The Netherlands consulate at Detroit.

The medallions are of famous Dutch naval heroes and are of a series of 12. They are facsimiles of Jacob VanHeenskerck (1567-1607) commander of the state fleet and famous navigator to North America, who was killed in battle; Adm. Pieter Pieterszoon Heyn (1577-1629), who conquered the Spanish silver fleet and was killed in the battle of Duinkerken; Maarten Harpertszoon Tromp (1598-1653), who fought in his first battle at the age of 19, became commander of the fleet and died in the battle of Terheyde; Michiel Adriaenszoon de Ruyter (1607-1676), merchant marine privateer in the war with the English, who became an admiral and later naval commander-in-chief and also died in battle, and adm. Willem Joseph Baron Van Bent, who was slain in the battle of Solebay.

Dr. Wichers paid tribute to the federal government for contributing \$4,800 as a WPA project and 4,320 as a NYA project toward operating the museum.
